#### **SUBJECT**

Authorize a three-year Licensed Training Provider Agreement with the American National Red Cross (Red Cross) to permit City of Dallas Park and Recreation Department Red Cross-certified instructors to use Red Cross licensed training materials in the instruction of water safety training courses – Financing: This action has no cost consideration to the City (recurring item)

#### **BACKGROUND**

The City of Dallas Park and Recreation Department (City) has a long history of providing Red Cross courses such as, Lifeguard Training, Water Safety Instructor Training, Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation, First Aid, and the Learn-to-Swim program. The Red Cross Licensed Training Provider Agreement outlines the responsibilities, terms, and conditions regarding the use of Red Cross licensed training materials in the provision of those courses.

The ability to conduct these courses is necessary for the safe operation of aquatic facilities. State and local health codes require aquatic facility operators to provide certified lifeguards and first responders for the safety of the public. The ability to provide certified water safety instructors is essential to providing swimming lessons and life-saving skills to both youth and adults at City aquatic facilities.

The City of Dallas Park and Recreation Department (City) has received funding to provide outreach aquatic programming at DISD swimming pools since 2017. City entered into a one-year agreement with DISD in January 2017, and then a three-year agreement in 2018 and conducted the program consisting of swim lessons, water aerobics, open swim, middle and high school swim training and swim coaching clinics during the school year. The current agreement expires December 31, 2020, necessitating the approval of a new agreement.

The City and DISD mutually wish to enter into a three-year agreement to continue to offer aquatics outreach programming with the following deal points:

- 1. The term of the agreement will be three years beginning January 1, 2021 and ending December 31, 2023.

  - f. Provide all emergency and rescue equipment required by state and local code.
  - g. Provide all emergency and rescue equipment required by state and local code.

#### **BACKGROUND**

The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) administers the Urban Outdoor Recreation Grant. Funding for this program comes from a portion of the state sales tax on sporting goods through the Texas Recreation and Parks Account, the Texas Large County and Municipality Recreation and Parks Account, and from the federal Land and Water Conservation Fund.

The scoring criteria for this grant program includes: development or the extension of parks; a locally adopted and department-approved park master plan, reduction of the threat to the public availability of a conservation or recreation opportunity, location in an underserved area; and involvement of public or private cooperation and meets the goals of TPWD Land and Water Resources Conservation and Recreation Plan.

Crawford Memorial Park is a 266.2-acre metropolitan park, that was established in 1964 in the South Dallas community. Crawford Memorial Park is identified by the Dallas Park and Recreation Department as the candidate for this funding application due to its completion of a Master Plan outlining the Phase 1 development priorities.

Based on the current master plan, the scope of Phase One development includes exercise stations, a signature playground, public art, a picnic facility, a park pavilion, a loop trail and pedestrian bridges. The focus of this application to TPWD will be directed toward the construction of a new loop trail and two pedestrian bridges.



#### **Scope of Policy**

It is the intent of the Park Board to provide parks and park facilities that are attractive, and user-friendly. From time to time, the opportunity arises to recognize groups or individuals for donating items or funding to provide furnishings and/or improvements in parks and park facilities. In order to ensure consistent, attractive, high quality plaques with appropriate content, this policy identifies the requirements and specifications for recognition plaques, or a recognition system; and building dedication plaques. This policy will apply to all parks except as exempted by separate agreement.

Fair Park is exempted from this policy by Ordinance 27079, Fair Park Historical Overlay District. Refer to the Interpretive Signage Policy for historical or interpretive plaques. Refer to the Naming Policy for the naming of parks, buildings, or components of parks and buildings.

#### I. Donation Plaques

Effective Date: 12/15/16

- A. Plaques will be considered for donations greater than \$1,500 or equivalent contributions related to park furnishings or other permanent improvements to the park system.
- B. For plaques recognizing donations under \$25,000, the Director, or his/her designee will determine the appropriate quality, design, size and materials. For park furnishings (benches, trash receptacles, picnic tables, etc.) a 2"x5" plaque size is appropriate.

- C. Signage to recognize volunteer efforts shall be in accordance with the Park Beautification and/or Maintenance Agreement.
- D. Plaques for donations or donated items with a value greater than \$25,000 require Park Board approval upon recommendation from the Planning and Design Committee. Plaques for donations or donated items with a value less than \$25,000 require the approval of the Director or his/her designee in accordance with this policy and prior to such approval the Director or his/her designee shall notify the Park Board representative from the District in which the plaque will be located.
- Plaques may also be part of a recognition system. A "recognition system" is defined as a framework that provides unification of multiple plaques, pavers, bricks, or other elements in certain location(s). Recognition systems require approval by the Park Board upon recommendation from the Planning and Design Committee. This approval may be combined with approval of plans and specifications for a larger project. Once a recognition system is approved by the Park Board, individual recognition system elements will be consistent with this policy.
- F. All stipulations and conditions regarding the plaque must be contained in a letter of agreement signed by the sponsoring party and the Director or his/her designee.
- G. Plaques may be given in honor or recognition of an individual or group and should not serve the purpose of a memorial. Refer to Exhibit A for examples of plaques which honor or recognize individuals.
- H. Sponsors shall bear the cost of design, manufacturing, installation (including the mounting structure), maintenance, repair and replacement of all plaques (due to loss, damage, vandalism or deterioration).

- I. Once the useful life of the donated item has expired or the item has been replaced, the plaque will be removed.
- J. For plaques that are installed as a requirement of a grant program, the rules of the grant are to be followed even in the event that they are in conflict with the stipulations of this policy. This action requires approval of the Park Board upon recommendation from the Planning and Design Committee.
- K. Recognition or commemorative elements associated with tree plantings or tree groves at park sites must comply with the provisions of this policy.
- L. Other recognition for significant contributions to the Park and Recreation Department will be in the form of certificates, resolutions, and other formats that the Board may determine to be appropriate. Annual award and recognition events, special mention at Board meetings, etc. are examples of how significant contributions may be recognized when a plaque is not considered appropriate.
- M. Building dedication plaques are covered under Section II of this policy.

#### II. Dedication Plaques

It is the policy of the Park and Recreation Department to provide a dedication plaque in conjunction with the construction of all new Park and Recreation Department buildings, significant additions and other major projects.

A. Dedication plaques can be manufactured from cast bronze, aluminum or similar durable materials; engraved in glass, stone or a similar material as an applied sign; or engraved into the wall, glass or floor surface of the building.

- B. Dedication plaques will be placed inside or outside the building near the entrance or at a prominent location.
- C. Dedication plaques include the name of the facility in prominent letters, "City of Dallas" under the facility name, and the date of the dedication (year) in smaller font size below "City of Dallas."
- D. The City Council seated at the time of approval of the plaque (prior to the dedication) will be listed on the left side, or top of the plaque with the Mayor, Mayor Pro Tem and Deputy Mayor Pro Tem listed at the top. The remaining Council Members will be listed alphabetically below the officers. In the event the approval of the plaque occurs after 1) the dedication of the project, or 2) the substantial completion of the project, and there has been a change in the membership of the City Council, then the Council Members seated at the time of the dedication, or substantial completion of the project, will be listed.
- E. The Park and Recreation Board seated at the time of approval of the plaque (prior to the dedication) will be listed on the right side, or bottom of, the plaque with the President and Vice-President listed at the top. The remaining Board Members will be listed alphabetically below the officers. In the event the approval of the plaque occurs after 1) the dedication of the project, or 2) the substantial completion of the project, and there has been a change in the membership of the Park and Recreation Board, then the Board members seated at the time of the dedication, or substantial completion of the project, will be listed.
- F. The City Manager and other appropriate staff will be listed in the area underneath the City Council, but not necessarily in the same column.
- G. The Park and Recreation Department Director, Assistant Director of Planning, Design and Construction and other appropriate staff will be listed under the Park and Recreation Board, but not necessarily in the same column.

- H. The architect, general contractor, and/or when applicable, the construction manager or design/build firm will be listed either under the City Council and Park and Recreation Board lists or in a separate column.
- It will be the option of the Park and Recreation Board to recognize individuals, groups, past Board or City Council Members, organizations, donors, other City departments or other funding agencies. This recognition can be either underneath the City Council and Park and Recreation Board lists, or as a separate column, depending on the nature of the list.
- J. A plaque may include an approved graphic or logo meaningful to the park site or project. The City of Dallas and Park and Recreation Department graphic logos are deemed approved.
- K. A drawing indicating the dedication plaque's form, materials, size and wording will be approved by the Park Board upon recommendation from the Planning and Design Committee. Any Board-requested revisions or modifications will be incorporated into the final design prior to its fabrication and installation.

# Example of Signs Which Honor or Recognize Individuals







#### **BACKGROUND**

The City of Dallas acquired land for Pacific Plaza in 1970 and additional land in 2008 located at 308 and 312 N St Paul St and 401 N Harwood St for the future development of a downtown park. Prior to acquisition the land had been used as a commercial surface parking lot. The City continued to operate the land as the same until funds were secured to develop the land as a park.

In 2017 and 2018 the Park and Recreation Department executed an operating endowment agreement and development and funding agreement for Pacific Plaza with Parks for Downtown Dallas, through its entity, Pacific Plaza LLC, which funded one-hundred percent of the design and construction costs for the develop of Pacific Plaza. The design and construction of the park included the close and vacate of Live Oak Street which divided Pacific Plaza and James W. Aston Park—subsequently James W. Aston Park was incorporated into the Pacific Plaza park development.

The agreement stipulated the dedication of the park at the completion of development. Construction of the park started in April 22, 2018 and was completed on October 6, 2020. In accordance with the Development and Funding Agreement with Pacific Plaza LLC, this action formally dedicates Pacific Plaza as dedicated municipal parkland.

#### PRIOR ACTION/REVIEW (COUNCIL, BOARDS, COMMISSIONS)

On May 3, 2018, the Park and Recreation Board authorized a development and funding agreement with Pacific Plaza LLC for funding and development of Pacific Plaza.



#### BACKGROUND

This item authorizes the acquisition from Audelia, L.P. of approximately 159,371 square feet of commercially improved land for a proposed new park located at 9759 Forest Lane (Exhibit A). The total consideration for this acquisition is \$5,025,000.00 based on an independent appraisal (\$5,000,000.00 plus closing cost and title expenses not to exceed \$25,000.00).

This acquisition fills one of many parkland service gaps in Council District 10. The subject site, which is on the market for sale, is currently being used as a shopping center. The park site was identified as a favorable location within District 10 for future development of a variety of park amenities and improvements. The existing structure(s) may be demolished for the development of a park or repurposed for park uses as determined through public-input and district needs. #### BACKGROUND

In 1937, Dr. William Waring Samuell deeded fifteen (15) properties to the Park and Recreation Department, where one of those properties was Samuell Farm, located at 100-US-80, Mesquite, Texas. The 386.8 acres of Samuell Farm are in an unincorporated section of Dallas City, boarded by Mesquite and Sunnyvale. From 1937 to 1982, Samuell Farm was utilized by the public as an open park. In the 1970's the Park Board reviewed unsolicited proposals for programing activities and in 1982 to 1981, a working farm was funded and programed to provide educational and recreational opportunities for residents of Dallas County. Due to budget reductions in the 1990's the farm's animal and livestock operations ceased in 2001.

Currently, Samuell Farm is available for picnic, wedding and special event registration for run, walks and cycling events. Park Maintenance provides service during normal operating hours (5am to 11pm daily).

The proposed operations, which include operating the Outdoor Adventure Program through Recreation Services, continue current operations as a reservation location and a one (1) acre urban farm development.

The Outdoor Adventures (OA) Program introduces youth and their families to kayaking, mountain biking, nature photography, geocaching, archery, fishing and camping. Since Summer 2017, OA has served over 3,000 participants and has garnered the interest and support of other local and national park systems. This program offers Summer and Spring Break Camps.

#### **BACKGROUND**

On June 25, 2003, the City entered into a multi-year agreement with Texas Discovery Gardens (a non-profit organization) to manage and operate the Discovery Gardens building and surrounding grounds at Fair Park for a ten-year period. The agreement was extended on November 7, 2013 for a ten-year period. The agreement with Texas Discovery Gardens requires the execution of a separate funding contract to authorize the stipends payable during the current year.

On October 24, 2018, City Council authorized a management contract with Fair Park First for management and operation of Fair Park for the Park and Recreation Department for a term of twenty years, with two five-year extension options by Resolution No. 18-1531, which included an assignment of the underlying agreement with Texas Discovery Gardens to Fair Park First. However, the assigned contract does not contain a funding provision for community outreach and other related programming services. 

#### **BACKGROUND**

The City of Dallas Greenhouse facility in Crawford Park is located at 8740 Elam Road. The contract premises include 50,000 square feet of greenhouse space, ¼ acre for storage/stock space and an operations building.

In 1988, the City of Dallas Greenhouse operation was privatized and a revenue contract was established providing lease payments to the City in the form of bedding plants to the Park and Recreation Department and reimbursing the City for the greenhouse communications, sanitation, electricity and natural gas charges.

Southwest Perennials, Inc. has operated the City Greenhouse facility since 1995. The current contract with Southwest Perennials, Inc. provides \$45,000 of bedding plants annually, to the six park maintenance districts, and the five golf courses. Southwest Perennials, Inc. has made reimbursements to the City of Dallas for all greenhouse utility charges totaling approximately \$45,000 annually. In addition, Southwest Perennials, Inc. has provided plant material donations annually to park beautification projects, community events, churches, schools and charitable organizations.

Southwest Perennials, Inc. provides tours to multiple professional organizations such as the International Plant Propagators Society Southern Region and the ASHS Floricultural Group. Southwest Perennials, Inc. also provides maintenance and repairs to the greenhouse buildings, including greenhouse glass replacement.
