Agenda Item 2. A motion by Rodney Schlosser, seconded by Jesse Moreno, to approve the minutes of the October 19, 2017 Park and Recreation Board Meeting, was carried. The vote was unanimous.

Agenda Item 3. Rick Watson, Deputy Chief, Dallas Police Department, was not in attendance.

A request by Bo Slaughter to address the floor was made. President Abtahi granted a few minutes for Mr. Slaughter to speak regarding board/staff relationship, decorum and Park Board focus.

A motion by Jeff Kitner, seconded by Calvert Collins-Bratton to discuss agenda items #10 and #11 before moving to Consent Agenda items, was carried. The vote was unanimous.

Agenda Item 4. Samuel Stiles, President, Dallas Parks Foundation, briefed the Park and Recreation Board about their organization.

Agenda Item 5. Daniel Huerta, Assistant Director, Park and Recreation briefed the Park and Recreation Board about the Heart of Dallas Bowl.

Timberglen Trail (12) — A motion by Jesse Moreno, seconded by Bo Slaughter, to authorize an Operating and Maintenance Agreement with Carrollton-Farmers Branch Independent School District for the use and maintenance of the Oncor easement for the Timberglen Trail - Financing: No cost consideration to the City, was carried. The vote was unanimous.

Agenda Item 9. California Crossing (6) – A motion by Jesse Moreno, seconded by Bo Slaughter, to authorize an amendment to an existing lease agreement with Texas Military Department to extend the lease agreement an additional five years for approximately 10,814 square feet of office and maintenance space located at 1775 California Crossing Road to be used as a Park and Recreation District 5 Maintenance Facility for the period June 1, 2035 through May 31, 2040 – Financing: No cost consideration to the City, was carried. The vote was unanimous.

ITEMS FOR INDIVIDUAL CONSIDERATION

Agenda Item 10. Randall Park (14) - A motion by Paul Sims, seconded by Becky Rader, to authorize an amendment to the Interlocal Agreement with Dallas Independent School District to allow Dallas Independent School District to temporarily use the existing parking lot at Randall Park during school hours and designate the spaces for teacher parking for two years, located at 201 South Glasgow Drive and construct no additional parking -Financing: No cost consideration to the City (deferred from August 3, 2017) was placed. An amendment by Rodney Schlosser, seconded by Robb Stewart to approve Mr. Sims' motion allowing DISD to temporarily use parking at the existing lot and construct approximately 22 additional parking spaces for temporary use during construction, was made - with Mr. Stewart motioning to call the question. The motion to call the question did not receive a second and was not carried. Jesse Moreno added an amendment to Mr. Schlosser's motion stating that the park sign monument would match the architecture of the school using brick on the columns [at DISD's expense of approximately \$3000], was carried by majority vote (10-3, 2 absent). A motion to call the question by Jeff Kitner, seconded by Robb Stewart was carried by majority vote (10-3, 2 absent). The vote on the original motion by Mr. Sims, seconded by Ms. Rader with the stated amendments to construct the additional parking and match the monument sign to the school's architecture at DISD's expense, was carried by majority vote (8-5, 2 absent).

Agenda Item 11. Cypress Waters Trail (6) – A motion by Rodney Schlosser, seconded by Robb Stewart, to authorize an Interlocal Agreement with Dallas County for designing, constructing, and maintaining a portion of the Cypress Waters Trail - Financing: No cost consideration to the City (deferred from October 19, 2017), was carried, by majority vote (12-1, 2 absent).

SUBJECT

Authorize a five-year agreement, with two five-year renewal option with Dallas United Crew, Inc. to design, develop, construct, operate, maintain and pay for a Portable Equipment Shelter to store rowing equipment only at White Rock Lake for high school rowing programs - Estimated annual revenue: \$6,200

BACKGROUND

On November 14, 2012, the City of Dallas entered into an agreement with Dallas United Crew, Inc. for the construction, renovation, operation and maintenance of a boathouse and other improvements at White Rock Lake. The purpose of that boathouse was to store rowing, kayaking, dragon boats and other oar and paddle sports. Dallas United Crew, Inc., at its sole cost was to undertake the development of the premises as approved by the Director or designee.

The Park and Recreation Board elected to terminate the agreement for convenience on December 17, 2015. On February 23, 2016, the City of Dallas approved an Outdoor Program Permit for Dallas United Crew to continue to conduct paddle sports programs at White Rock Lake. The term of that agreement was for six (6) months and the Outdoor Fee Based Program Permit has been extended each six months since.

Dallas United Crew, Inc. has addressed issues related to the initial development attempt and is positioned to provide for the development of a portable equipment shelter at the premises which will store rowing and other paddle sports equipment at White Rock Lake along East Lawther Drive.

Obligations of the City include the following:

1. The term of the contract is one (1) five-year period with two five (5) year renewals and allows the City to terminate for convenience.

Authorize a five-year agreement, with two five-year renewal option with Dallas United Crew, Inc. to design, develop, construct, operate, maintain and pay for a Portable Equipment Shelter to store rowing equipment only at White Rock Lake for high school rowing programs - Estimated annual revenue: \$6,200 – page 2

Obligations of Dallas United Crew:

- Dallas United Crew (DUC) shall design, develop, construct, operate and maintain a portable (collapsible and removable tent like structure) equipment shelter on their current location for the purpose of sheltering and protecting their equipment for rowing and other oar and paddle sports for the enjoyment of citizens, middle and high school students and other interested in watersports. Design and location of the structure shall be subject to Director approval.
- 2. Dallas United Crew at its sole cost shall undertake the development of the premises as approved by Director or designee. DUC has 24-months from date of execution of the Agreement to commence construction of the improvements. If DUC fails to commence construction, City, at its option, may terminate the Agreement for convenience.
- 3. DUC must provide Director with proof of sufficient financing and financial resource to ensure construction can be completed upon commencement
- 4. DUC has the right to contract for and grant sponsorships and naming rights for the park improvements located on the Premises provided the Director shall have the right to approve, or reject, any naming of all or any portion of the park improvements on the Premises
- 5. DUC will continue to pay the set rental amount of \$3,100 every 6 months (\$6,200 yearly); payments will be due no later than January 10th and July 10th annually for the duration of the agreement.
- 6. DUC shall utilize, or disperse parking, between three (3) parking lots on the White Rock Lake Park property so as to not impeded the general public's parking and access. DUC will continue to encourage carpooling by participants.
- 7. DUC shall monitor security and crowd control within the Premises and any areas occupied or utilized by it or its contractors. DUC's responsibility to monitor security, however shall not in any way prevent, hinder or affect City's Police Department and Fire Department from providing services and performing their official duties as required for the Premises.
- 8. DUC will operate within park hours. The Premises (other than the secured equipment storage), services and dock provided at or through the Premises shall remain open and accessible for public use pursuant to DUC's guidelines and as approved by the Director. The hours of open operation for public use and special events shall be commercially reasonable and consistent with good practices and standards within the industry and subject to Director's approval.

Authorize a five-year agreement, with two five-year renewal option with Dallas United Crew, Inc. to design, develop, construct, operate, maintain and pay for a Portable Equipment Shelter to store rowing equipment only at White Rock Lake for high school rowing programs - Estimated annual revenue: \$6,200 - page 2

- 9. Further potential improvements DUC may undertake shall include: parking lot grading and ADA parking development, both subject to approval by the Director within the term of DUC's contractual term.
- 10. Potential public dock improvements, including upgrading and expanding public dock, subject to approval by the Director.
- 11. DUC shall submit annual financial reports and certified financial statements to the Director for review.
- 12.DUC shall commit to allocating 10% of its annual gross receipts to be allocated towards collegiate need based scholarships to be awarded annually. Records of funds and scholarships awarded will be subject to review by the Director annually.
- 13.DUC, through its volunteers, will continue to be a For The Love Of The Lake shoreline group and actively promote and engage in community stewardship.
- 14. Annually, DUC and the Department, no later than January 30th, shall develop and agree to performance metrics for the following year. These performance metrics are subject to approval by the Director.
- 15. Minimum performance metrics to be set annually shall include, but is not limited to, the following:
 - DUC will host a minimum of four (4) on-campus recruiting events for youth rowing each year for DISD and continue to promote collegiate scholarship potential from within.
 - DUC will conduct introductory learn-to-row events for adults and children in the community and through it's summer Rec Camps on an annual basis.
 - DUC will award at a minimum, one (1) needs based collegiate scholarship

FISCAL INFORMATION

Dallas United Crew shall continue to pay the set rental amount to the City of Dallas Estimated annual revenue: \$6,200.

SUBJECT

Authorize staff to proceed working with the Office of Economic Development to seek authorization of a Chapter 380 Economic Development Grant Agreement with ESPN in an amount not to exceed \$800,000 in consideration of bringing teams from the Big Ten, Big 12 or Conference USA to play in an annual bowl game at the Cotton Bowl Stadium at Fair Park in December of 2018 and 2019 pursuant to the City of Dallas Public/Private Partnership Program— Cost Not to Exceed \$800,000 — Financing General Funds

BACKGROUND

The first Cotton Bowl collegiate game was held on January 1, 1937 at the Cotton Bowl Stadium with the TCU Horned Frogs defeating the Marquette Golden Avalanche, 16-6. A bowl game has been held at the Cotton Bowl Stadium each year since except in 2010. Except for the Rose Bowl, the Cotton Bowl Stadium has hosted more bowl games than any stadium in the United States.

On November 14, 2012 the City of Dallas and the Heart of Dallas, a Texas non-profit corporation, entered into a Chapter 380 Grant Agreement. Under the authority of Chapter 380 of the Texas Local Government Code, the City of Dallas has made grants of public money to (1) promote local economic development; and (2) stimulate business and commercial activity in the City of Dallas and more particularly within the South Dallas/Fair Park area, The City of Dallas desired to prove an economic incentive to the Heart of Dallas to bring teams from the Big Ten, Big 12, or Conference USA to play in an annual bowl game at the Cotton Bowl Stadium at Fair Park in order to promote with the City of Dallas and in particularly within the South Dallas/Fair Park area that would promote (1) development and diversification of the economy; (2) elimination of unemployment and the underemployment; and (3) development and expansion of commerce.

The Heart of Dallas expressed a commitment to contract with the City of Dallas to host bowl games with specified NCAA football conferences and in consideration for the completion and compliance of said functions, the City of Dallas committed to make an economic development grant to the Heart of Dallas of \$400,000, renewed annually at the sole discretion of the Dallas City Council for up to five (5) additional 12-month periods,

Authorize staff to proceed with pursuing a Chapter 380 Economic Development Grant Agreement with ESPN to bring teams in from the Big Ten, Big 12 or Conference USA to play in an annual bowl game at the Cotton Bowl Stadium at Fair Park in December of 2018 and 2019 – Cost Not to Exceed \$800,000 – Financing Current Funds – page 2

subject to annual approval and appropriation by the Dallas City Council and continued statutory authorization of the incentive under the Act.

In 2013, ESPN took over management and operation of the Plains Capital Heart of Dallas Bowl and in 2014 Zaxby's became the title sponsor of the Bowl. The December 26, 2017 game will be the final bowl game under the current Chapter 380 Grant Agreement between the City of Dallas and Heart of Dallas/ESPN.

The bowl game on December 27, 2016 between Army and North Texas had an attendance of 39,117 and a total economic impact of \$5,903,619. The bowl game played on December 26, 2014 between Louisiana Tech and Illinois had an attendance of 31,297 and an economic impact of \$14,890,630.

Via a separate agreement, the Heart of Dallas/ESPN has two years remaining in a six-year partnership agreement with the Big 12 (seventh selection), Big Ten (ninth selection) and Conference USA. Remaining matchups include Conference USA versus Big Ten in 2018 and Conference USA versus Big 12.

On November 2, 2017, the Park and Recreation Board was briefed on the history of the bowl game and future funding Chapter 380 Economic Development Grant Agreement funding options. Staff is recommending that a new two-year funding agreement be pursued as a shorter term would result in better aligning of City of Dallas interests with contract terms of any new agreement between ESPN and the college conferences.

The proposed Chapter 380 Economic Development Grant Agreement is subject to the following key terms:

- 1. The grant shall be payable in two installments of \$400,000
 - The first installment will be payable in December 2018 upon completion and verification of ESPN bringing teams in from the Big Ten, Big 12 or Conference USA to play in an annual bowl game at the Cotton Bowl Stadium at Fair Park to promote with the City of Dallas, and in particularly within the South Dallas/Fair Park area that will promote development and diversification of the economy; elimination of unemployment and underemployment; and development and expansion of commerce
 - The second installment will be payable in December 2019 upon completion and verification of ESPN bringing teams in from the Big Ten, Big 12 or Conference USA to play in an annual bowl game at the Cotton Bowl Stadium at Fair Park to promote with the City of Dallas, and in particularly within the South Dallas/Fair Park area that will promote development and diversification of the economy; elimination of unemployment and underemployment; and development and expansion of commerce

Authorize staff to proceed with pursuing a Chapter 380 Economic Development Grant Agreement with ESPN to bring teams in from the Big Ten, Big 12 or Conference USA to play in an annual bowl game at the Cotton Bowl Stadium at Fair Park in December of 2018 and 2019 – Cost Not to Exceed \$800,000 – Financing Current Funds – page 3

- 2. ESPN will contract with the City of Dallas to host bowl games in the Cotton Bowl Stadium with specified NCAA football conferences in 2018 and 2019
- 3. ESPN will organize and manage advertising, broadcasting, news media, promotional activities and other such related game functions
- 4. In consideration for the completion and compliance of said function, the City of Dallas commits to make a Chapter 380 Economic Development Grant Agreement to ESPN in an amount of \$800,000, payable in two installments of \$400,000 each December of 2018 and 2019.
- 5. The Chapter 380 Economic Development Grant Agreement shall renew each year at the sole discretion of the Dallas City Council for up to one (1) additional 12-month period, subject to annual approval and appropriation by the Dallas City Council
- 6. Continued statutory authorization of this incentive under the Act
- 7. ESPN to host the annual bowl game at the Cotton Bowl Stadium at Fair Park in December 2018 and December 2019

Pursuant to the City of Dallas Public/Private Partnership (PPP) Program, Guidelines and Criteria (effective for the period of January 1, 2017 through December 31, 2018) the project does not meet the minimum eligibility requirements for a Non-Target Area.

Notwithstanding, the project represents a unique economic development opportunity and, as such is considered a "Non-Conforming Project" pursuant to the PPP Program. As a Non-Conforming Project, the proposed Grant requires approval by a three-fourths vote of the Dallas City Council.
