Mission Statement

Mission Statement

To improve the sense of public safety and confidence in the Dallas Police Department within the community by providing:

- A means for citizens to communicate their concerns regarding alleged inappropriate police behavior;
- An avenue for the public to obtain some remedial action regarding Internal Affairs
 Division investigations and Division Referral reviews in circumstances in which
 the Board deems same appropriate and as provided for in the Board's enabling
 ordinance;
- A vehicle (the Board) for making impartial recommendations for changes or improvements in the operation of the Dallas Police Department;
- An advisory body to the City Council with regard to the operations and policies of the Dallas Police Department, its policies, operations and practices, as well as the public's perception of same.

Objective

Objective

The Dallas Citizens Police Review Board meets once monthly (the second Tuesday) in order to provide citizens who have made complaints against police department employees an opportunity to voice dissatisfaction with the results of the Police Department Internal Affairs Division Investigations and Chain-of-Command (Division Referrals) reviews and to develop recommendations to the Dallas Police Department through the Office of the City Manager for changes or improvements in the operation of the Dallas Police Department, as well as to perform its advisory function to the City Council with regard to the operations and policies of the Dallas Police Department, as well as the public's perception of same.

Guiding Principles

Guiding Principles

Authority:

Dallas City Code, Chapter 37, Article III Dallas Citizens Police

Review Board (CPRB) Section 37-31

Members:

15 members, one appointed by each member of the City Council

All members shall be appointed for a term to expire on September 1. All subsequent appointments will be made in August of each odd-numbered year for a two-year term beginning on September 1. Members shall serve until their successors are appointed and

qualified.

Qualifications:

No special qualifications for membership

Officers:

Mayor appoints the chair, subject to confirmation by a majority of

the City Council; full City Council appoints the Vice-Chair

Functions:

The Citizens Police Review Board is primarily an advisory board. The Board hears complaints against Dallas Police Officers, where the citizen Is not satisfied with the results of the Internal Affairs Division and Chain-of-Command (division level) investigations. The

Board's powers are set by City ordinance.

WHAT THE REVIEW BOARD CAN AND CANNOT DO:

The Review Board cannot:

- 1. Overturn Internal Affairs and Chain-of-Command (division level) decisions.
- 2. Require the officer being complained of to appear before the Board.
- 3. Award money damages for citizens.
- 4. Discipline or recommend discipline of police officers.
- 5. Decide who was right and who was wrong in a particular case.
- 6. Dismiss tickets or charges against citizens.

The Review Board can:

- 1. Make recommendations to the City Manager's Office concerning officers that are the subject of a complaint.
- 2. Agree or disagree with an Internal Affairs or Chain-of-Command (division level) decision.
- 3. Request Internal Affairs or Chain-of-Command to conduct further investigations.
- 4. Do its own investigation or hire a third party investigator.
- 5. Subpoena Witnesses (other than the officer being complained of).

Training

Training

The ordinance requires that board members are provided a training session to become familiar with police procedures. One training was accomplished during 2018.
